It's been a lovely week at Yoxall St Peter's, full of teamwork, exciting learning and deep, spiritual thinking.

In RE, Classes have been continuing their look at Holy Week and the Easter story, working out how people must have felt at the time - and how it makes people feel today. Next week, Father Jeremy will be in school to talk about the symbolism and meaning of the Holy Communion, after the original story was vividly and poignantly brought to life by Open the Book on Tuesday.

We're starting to collate the results of our whole school survey of Worship. One clear thing that has come through is that the children want to take a more active part in Worship, leading it themselves. You will see us putting into action the children's suggestions throughout the coming weeks.

Now that we are starting to get back to normal, each class will be leading a service every half term, as they always used to. We are also getting our Church Council to coordinate 'pop-up' worships, based on our themes of the week.

The schedule will be: Class 4 – Vesak – 4<sup>th</sup> May Class 3 – Pentecost –  $18^{th}$  May Class 5 – Ascension –  $25^{th}$  May Class 2 – Trinity –  $8^{th}$  June Class 1 – You've Got A Friend in Me -  $15^{th}$  June

In our Worships, we also look at other major festivals and faiths. From now on, we will publish a diary for each month, so you can see what other faiths or stories we will be covering, should you wish to share these with your child.

# Major Religious Holidays for April

4/2 to 5/2 – Ramadan: The holy month of fasting, introspection, and prayer celebrated by Muslims.

4/14 – Vaisakhi: An ancient festival for Hindus that simultaneously celebrates that Solar New Year and spring harvest.

4/15 to 4/23 – Passover: A 7-day holiday in the Jewish faith that honours the freeing of the Israeli slaves.

4/17 – Easter: The most important day in the Christian faith when we celebrate the resurrection of Our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

4/24 – Feast of the Divine Mercy: A feast day on the second Sunday of Easter when Christians seek Christ's forgiveness and grace.
